Grade: 1st Unit: 3 Time Frame: February - March

Essential Question: What is a community?

Focus Questions: (What is my child thinking about?)

- What are resources and how to we get them?
- How are maps used to find different types of information about a community?
- What are the responsibilities of a citizen within a community?
- · Why do communities need rules and laws?
- Who are our leaders and how do they help us?
- How can people help the community?
- How can responsible citizens help change rules and laws?

Student Outcomes: (What can my child do after this unit is over?)

- Examine how maps can represent many types of information.
- Apply cardinal directions and symbols in a map key or legend.
- Design a map with a key illustrating important resources needed by a community.
- Explain the roles, responsibilities and actions of a citizen.
- Apply knowledge of rules and laws.
- Identify roles and responsibilities of citizens in the lawmaking process.
- · Describe why laws are changed.
- Identify and understand the role of local, state, and national leaders.
- Explain how natural resources are used to meet the needs of a community.
- Analyze images of human-made resources and structures to determine how and why they meet a community's needs.
