Essential Question: What does it mean to be free?

**Focus Questions:** (What is my child thinking about?)

- How does the Constitution provide help people and keep things fair?
- · How do the Federal (State, Local) government promote order and support its citizens?
- What freedoms are given by the government?
- · Why were these freedoms chosen?
- How do the freedoms guaranteed by the government affect my every day life?
- How do these freedoms affect the government and my everyday life?
- How have various groups struggled for equality?

## **Student Outcomes:** (What can my child do after this unit is over?)

- Describe the structure of the Federal, State, and Local Government
- · Understand the general responsibilities of each level and branch of government
- Discuss the importance of the Constitution and what it does for our country and its citizens
- Connect the freedoms given in the Bill of Rights to everyday life
- Recognize that the Constitution is a living document to be revised as the US grows and changes
- Understand the civil struggles of African Americans and women, and how they received their rights
